2. Homelessness

City of Kamloops is working with CMHA to have a winter shelter in the Stuart Wood starting Nov 1 to Mar 31. The mission is to make sure everyone has shelter to go to this year.

They are still working with BCH for temporary modular and permanent modular homes for homeless individuals. Hopefully there will be something in the works in the next 18-24 months. An advantage to this type of housing is that there will be supports involved and they are very fast to build and have ready.

Arjun Singh mentioned and confirmed that well managed shelters work and they have less of a negative impact on the community.

BC Housing is looking for potential operators for the modular housing projects.

Coming soon will be a map and brochure for sharps disposal container locations. Also coming will be more information about a mini storage unit for homeless to store their belongings.

CMHA:

The winter EWR shelter this year will be activated from Nov 1- Mar 31 every day. It will not be run by temperature this year. The shelter is working on a way to accept pets as there are more individuals not accessing shelter because they have a pet. There are 50 beds at the winter shelter and if more are needed BCH will be contacted. There are supports in place to help transition individuals from the winter shelter to regular shelter. CMHA is working with Ask Wellness to move clients from shelter to temporary housing. The shelter hours are 8:00 pm to 6:00am on a first come first serve basis. The shelter is trying to track data on homeless situation.

There is a clean-up coordinator on the premise and there will be a neighborhood discussion coming up.

ASK is working together with CMHA. They are in the 4th year with temporary hotel shelter (Star Lodge and Columbia Inn) with 40 beds to house 20 clients from Nov 1 to Mar 31. Ask Wellness already has the first 10 clients from the first-round intake.

The Maverick will be opening in early December. There will be 42 units available. The plan is for clients to take vocational training while in the housing and be able to transition out in 2 years.
